PRESENTATION

The Fundación MarViva's Political Advocacy Program in Panama, supported by the Central American Regional Security Initiative of the United States Government (CARSI), is honored to present to the Panamanian community the second edition of the Guide for the Analysis of Crimes Against the Environment. This guide aims to further strengthen the interpretation and enforcement of Environmental Criminal Law in our country, serving as the ultimate measure for protecting the environment and its various components.

The first edition of this guide was released in 2011, as part of a cooperation agreement with the Public Prosecutor's Office. It was developed based on contributions from judicial officers from both the Public Prosecutor's Office and the Judicial Branch, as well as legal experts from the then National Environmental Authority (ANAM), now the Ministry of Environment (MiAMBIENTE), and the Aquatic Resources Authority of Panama (ARAP). This new edition updates the changes that have occurred since then in criminal legislation, as well as in relevant administrative and international blank legislation, all revalidated with the assistance of judicial officers and other relevant authorities.

Our legal system has recognized the environment as a legally protected asset since the original 1972 Political Constitution, which included it in Chapter VII (Ecological Regime) of Title III (Individual and Social Rights and Duties). The 2004 Constitutional Reform (Legislative Act 1/2004) further expanded human rights protection by introducing a clause on unnamed rights and adding a second paragraph to Article 17 of the Constitution. This amendment broadened the scope of human rights protection, including diffuse rights like the right to a healthy environment, from a predominantly protective standpoint.

In the subsequent year, Law 5 of January 28, 2005, was enacted, integrating Title XIII (Crimes against the Environment) into the then-existing Penal Code (1982). This Title was structured into twenty articles, divided into Chapters I (Crimes against Natural Resources), II (Crimes against Wildlife), III (Crimes related to Processing, Approval, and Compliance with Environmental Documentation), IV (Crimes against Urban Planning Regulations), and V (Common Provisions). This law also introduced Article 2086-A to the Judicial Code (Unified Text 2001), establishing specific precautionary measures for preventing or addressing environmental damage.

This framework was retained in the new Criminal Code (2010), whose Unified Text (2016) preserved the numbering of Title XIII (Crimes against the Environment and Territorial Planning). The structure includes twenty-six articles, with Chapters I and II keeping their original names. Chapters III and IV were merged into one, now Chapter III (Crimes related to Planning, Approval, and Territorial Urban Compliance), and a new Chapter IV (Crimes against Domestic Animals) was added, along with Chapter V (Common Provisions). Additionally, Article 337 of the Code of Criminal Procedure introduced two specific precautionary measures for environmental and urban planning protection (MP, 2018).

Over the past decade, legislative and regulatory activities have been extensive, revising existing environmental norms, creating new ones, and approving or updating instruments for establishing protected areas and their management plans. Panama has also taken on new international commitments by signing Multilateral Environmental Agreements (MEAs). Therefore, periodically reviewing and updating applicable environmental regulations is crucial.

INTRODUCTION

This second edition of the Guide to the Analysis of Crimes Against the Environment is intended as a practical tool for justice operators, administrative staff, legal professionals, and anyone keen on comprehending the nature of environmental crimes in Panama. It also elucidates the laws and extensive regulatory frameworks that facilitate the enforcement of the criminal categories defined in the Criminal Code of Panama (MP, 2016). Retaining the structure of its predecessor, this edition introduces new sections and provides updated legal dogmatic analyses of each type of crime, categorized in their respective chapters.


The analysis starts with a detailed description of typical conduct (actions deemed punishable by criminal law) and unlawful acts (those against the law), and then addresses other aspects of the criminal category, such as:

- a) Protected Legal Property: Identified typically in the chapter's title, this edition breaks down various elements of the environment and human health, which are the general goods safeguarded by Environmental Criminal Law.
- b) Active Subject: This section specifies whether the perpetrator is qualified or not.
- c) Rector Verbs: Lists the actions, both in simple and aggravated forms.
- d) Consummation: Clarifies whether the crime involves danger/risk or results.
- e) Culpability: Distinguishes between fraudulent offenses and those admitting a negligent mode.

- f) Penalty: Details the nature of the punishment, whether it be imprisonment, day-fines, or community service.
- g) Aggravating Circumstances: Describes each circumstance and the associated penalty increase.
- h) Extenuating Circumstances: Notes if a negligent mode is recognized, which could reduce the penalty.
- i) Exemptions from Liability: Indicates if an exemption applies due to family subsistence reasons.
- j) Atypical Conducts: Outlines behaviors that do not constitute a crime.
- k) Applicable Environmental Norms: Provides a summary of a thesaurus (list of search terms) relevant to each crime category. Bibliographic references are now located in the Analytical Index, along with references related to the instruments establishing protected areas and zones for special management in the Southwestern Region, as well as resolutions approving their management plans. This organization aims to streamline the process of locating corresponding cross-references.

CRIMES AGAINST NATURAL RESOURCES

TYPICAL ANTIJURIDICAL CONDUCT 🖏 🔊

Article 399. The crime is committed by anyone who, contravening established environmental protection regulations, engages in the destruction, extraction, contamination, or degradation of natural resources.

PROTECTED LEGAL ASSET	Natural Resources: This includes Forestry Resources, Water Resources (Water), Hydrobiological Resources (Fishing and Aquaculture), Coastal Marine Resources, Mineral Resources, Soil, and Wildlife (Flora and Fauna, Biodiversity). Environment: This encompasses Environmental Health.
ACTIVE SUBJECT	The perpetrator can be any individual (not specifically defined).

AGGRAVATING CIRCUMSTANCES

(Penalty increase from 1/3 to 1/2)

- 1. Actions impacting protected areas or causing total or partial destruction of coastal marine ecosystems or wetlands.
- 2. Direct harm to watersheds.
- 3. Damage to areas of special biological, historical, archaeological, or scientific significance.
- 4. Significant adverse effects on surface or subterranean water resources, impacting ecosystems.
- 5. Endangering human health or life.
- 6. Use of explosive or toxic substances in fishing activities.
- 7. Conduct by industries or activities operating without requisite authorization or approval from the competent authority.
- 8. Falsification or concealment of information regarding environmental impact, or obstruction of inspections ordered by the competent authority.
- 2. Causing irreversible damage. Irreversible effects are those that make it impossible to return to the original state.
